I like to play.



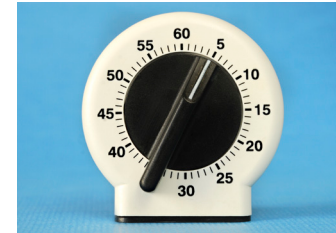
Sometimes I play by myself. Sometimes I play with my brother, Devonte.
