Sometimes it is hard to stay on our circle time spot. If we stand up, it will be hard for our friends to see and have fun. We can take deep breaths and look at the "we sit on our circle time spot" rule picture to help us remember to stay until circle is done.

We watch the teacher with our looking eyes so we can see all the fun things that happen in circle. We look at the teacher, so we know what to do next in circle.

We are following circle time rules when... We use our listening ears.



We like to sing songs and read stories in circle time. We use listening ears when our teacher is talking, and then we can follow directions.

We are following circle time rules when... We follow directions.



When our teacher says to sing, we all sing together. When our teacher says it's time to dance, we all dance together. When our teacher points to us, it is our turn to talk. We follow directions in circle time so that we can all have fun together.

When we follow the circle time rules, we are being safe and respectful. Everyone can see, learn, and have fun. We feel proud when we follow the circle time rules.
